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Who are we?

CNHC is the UK regulator for complementary healthcare practitioners, set up in the interest of the public.

What do we do?

CNHC's function is to enhance public protection by setting standards for registration. The CNHC quality mark is now recognised as the standards hallmark for the sector. This means that the general public, and those who commission the services of complementary healthcare practitioners, will be able to choose a CNHC registered professional with confidence.

Which professional groups do we regulate?

Practitioners of: Alexander Technique teaching, Aromatherapy, Bowen Therapy, Massage Therapy, Nutritional Therapy, Reflexology, Shiatsu, Sports & Remedial Therapy, Yoga Therapy.
Opening 2010-11 to practitioners of: Craniosacral Therapy, Healing, Hypnotherapy, Microsystems Acupuncture, Naturopathy, Reiki.

How do you know if someone is registered with CNHC?

Why was it set up?

CNHC was established with Government start-up funding to provide assurance to the public and others about the standards met by complementary healthcare practitioners.

We also offer a route for calling practitioners to account, where necessary.

How do you make a complaint?
